As the number of nuns declined, through the commitment of dedicated lay women and men, our schools continued. Many of the teachers who have worked in our grade school spent most of their teaching careers here. The legacy of the laity's commitment is seen to this very day. Our school continues to have both outstanding leadership as well as an excellent group of teachers. Our teachers continue to be great role models that care about not only the education of the children, but also their overall growth.

The graduation liturgy for our 8th graders

was a beautiful celebration. That evening, we sent them forth to continue their education for the rest of their lives. Over the years, I've seen the tremendous changes that have taken place in their lives particularly due to their experiences here in our school. I've known some of them for all of their lives, as theu were baptized here at IC since I've been here. I recall when they began school as 3-year-olds and continued on for the next eleven years. Throughout this time, they have experienced our supportive faith-filled school family that has helped to provide them a solid foundation for their futures. We always tell them that whatever they do and wherever they go that they will always be part of the IC family.

I'd like to also express my heartfelt gratitude daily basis. Our parent's club has again served as the backbone for the school. I continue to remark to people of other parishes my gratitude for the dedication and commitment shown to our school by the parent's club.

Likewise, our school board has served in a key advisory role. The wisdom present in this group of men and women has had a very positive effect in the advice that they have given.
